In 1983, she was appointed by the Commissioner on Aging to serve on the State Department of Aging's Minority Advisory Committee. The American Association of Retired Persons selected Mary to serve as a volunteer spokesperson for its Minority Affairs Initiative in 1990. Her commitment to people in general involved her in such organizations as the Urban League, NAACP, and the National Council of Black Women for Political Action.

Senior high school students with a 2.5 (C+) or higher GPA at the end of the Fall 2020 semester.

- submit grades.
- submit one (1) letter of reference from a teacher/coach or school counselor.
- Respond in 100-200 words: "Please explain a challenge you have faced in your life, how it affected you or changed you, and what you did to overcome it."
- Student must write an essay of between 250-500 words on the following topic, "What is your understanding of affirmative action, and how has it benefited society?" If you feel that it has not benefited society, please discuss.
